
Joe Scaminaci 7th/8th Grade Math





New Library Procedures 2020/2021 Pandemic Edition:

While online eBooks are a viable option for anyone interested in it, I would also like to offer pickup of books students place on hold. These books would be ready on the next school day once the student has placed the book on hold. In order to hold a book, the student must be signed into the library catalog with their Google credentials (don't include the @madisoned.org part). I will pull the book/s, check them out to that student, bag them and place them in the office for pickup. The office will only hold them for one week for pickup. You will receive an email when your hold is ready for pick up. The office will only hold them for one week.

Once returned, the books will be treated (Lysol spray) and quarantined for a week. Only then will they be ready to be checked out by another student. Check out times are 2 weeks, and 2 books at a time.

Other resources available to students are the public library and World Book Online.The **public library** has online content as well as curbside pickup similar to ours. Measure of Academic Progress

MAP is a computerized adaptive formative assessment our students will take a few times this year. The results help teachers identify gaps in knowledge and areas for student growth as well as allow teachers to change or inform their instructional practices. Meadows students will be taking the math assessment this Thursday (7th and 8th grades) and Friday (5th and 6th grades) and the ELA assessment next week Tuesday and Wednesday during block classes as outlined in the table below.
